You made the move to Switzerland

this year and it's been going quite well, are you able to give Mark an inside information on our opponents?

Yeah obviously I've been playing in the Swiss League this year. I mean nothing too crazy, I've a couple of teammates that have played with some of the guys growing up, so I'm asking questions here and there. But I mean, we're pretty familiar with the Swiss, obviously playing them last summer too. So it's an exciting matchup for us, kind of knowing who they have coming in.

How did that move to Switzerland come about?

So they had reached out to my



agent to see if I would have had any interest in the first place. And then obviously playing in Switzerland for the two friendly games last summer, I guess I've been on their radar somewhat, so they made an offer and I was happy to go over there and play there.

Where is your team based? How are you finding the adjustment?

Yeah, I'm enjoying it. I'm in Zurich,



lovely city and the league is pretty strong. I'm enjoying that too. And everything has been good so far, no complaints at all.

Are there many similarities to playing in Ireland?

I would say it's awfully dissimilar to Ireland in terms of it being a pretty small community. All the teams know each other. Guys are very familiar, familiar with each other and each other's games. So that's kind of been a similarity too, and it's been an adjustment. Obviously coming in as a foreign player, there is a bigger expectation on you than you would be in a local player in the Irish league, as I was last year.

So that's been an adjustment. But I mean, I'm off to a good start having good form and just kind of hoping to continue that on into this week.

Does Zurich live up to the stereotype of being expensive?

Yeah that's definitely been an





adjustment too. It's basically everyday stuff like food or going for a coffee, that kind of thing definitely adds up. I mean, Dublin's heading in that direction now so I won't get too ahead of myself.

How about finding accomodation? We all know that is a big issue back home?

I'm lucky enough that my club kind of takes care of all of that for us. So, I mean, it would have been a nightmare trying to go into a city like Zurich looking for accommodation and trying to figure out the ins and outs of it, but that's been completely taken care of by the club, which is ideal, lovely apartment, middle of the city.

What is it like to be representing Ireland in our first ever FIBA Basketball

World Cup qualifying campaign?

I mean, it's really exciting. It's kind of great to see us back on this stage. I think we've kind of shown over the past couple of years that we've continued to grow as a squad and as a team, and it's just fun to continue on with that. Now we've got a pretty young team here and just kind of trying to develop on our last couple of years and try get some results.

I mean, I think we're past the stage of showing up and trying to, you know, make up numbers and that kind of thing. So we're we're definitely looking to come in and get two results here this week, and that's the main focus.


